News from the May 6th Town Council Meeting

- By Consent Agenda, Town Council:
 - Approved property tax releases from the Henderson County Tax Office.
 - Set a Public Hearing for June 10, 2024 to consider potential amendments to the Fletcher Land Development Code Articles 12, 14, 15, and 16.
 - Approved a \$178,425 surety performance bond from Windsor Built Homes for Phase II infrastructure in The Authors subdivision on Rutledge Road.
- Mark Biberdorf, Town Manager, mentioned that the project list for our Legislative Delegation has been modified slightly. The list now includes legislative assistance funding requests for extending the Cane Creek Greenway, extending sanitary sewer service to some residents off Fanning Bridge Road, and implementing the use of Automated License Plate Readers by our Police Department.
- Mark Biberdorf provided updates on several ongoing matters:
 - A meeting was held with staff members from Senator Budd's office and Congressman Edwards office to discuss legislative funding assistance for Fletcher potential projects (as noted above).
 - The recommended 2024-2045 fiscal year budget was presented to Council last week and Mr. Biberdorf is currently working on the budget message. He will have a draft budget available for public comment and review by May 29th. A condensed version of the budget will also be presented at the June 10th Council meeting.
 - A representative from Crown Castle has provided a list to the Town of small cell facilities that will be installed in Fletcher. Crown Castle has received encroachment authorization from NC DOT for several node locations on Underwood Road, all of which are within the DOT rights-ofway. Construction should begin within the next month on these locations. The node location originally planned near the Windsor Forest neighborhood is on indefinite hold and Crown Castle is considering alternative locations for that node.

How to Dispose of Large Items and "Hard to Dispose Of" Items


White goods such as refrigerators, washers, dryers, water heaters, etc. can be picked up by Fletcher Public Works by calling 828-654-9208 or by visiting https://www.fletchernc.org/departments/public-works/white-goods-pick/ to make your request.

Peripheral electronics such as telephones, laptops, keyboards, computer towers, scanners, printers, stereos, mice, etc. can be taken to the Henderson County Convenience Center at 265 Convenience Center Drive in Hendersonville, NC 28791. **Scrap metal** items such as metal bed frames, lawnmowers, gas grills (without the propane tank), microwaves, metal patio furniture, etc. can also be taken there. **Automotive products** such as anti-freeze, oil filters, motor oil (5 gallon limit), and batteries are also accepted at the Convenience Center.

Large household items such as carpet, linoleum and other flooring, mattresses, box springs, household furniture, wicker patio furniture, large toys, folding sports chairs, and garden hose reels can be taken to the Henderson County Transfer Station at 191 Transfer Station Drive in Hendersonville, NC 28791. **TV's and computer monitors** are accepted, for a \$20 per item fee. **Construction debris** such as wood, scrap lumber, bricks, cement blocks, windows, sliding glass doors, asphalt shingles, and unpainted wood pallets are also accepted at the Transfer Station.

Household chemicals, cleaners, and **pesticides** are collected during special Spring & Fall events at the Convenience Center. Visit https://www.hendersoncountync.gov/solid-waste/page/household-hazardous-waste-collection for more information. **Paint** is also accepted at special collection events during the year at the Transfer Station. Visit https://www.hendersoncountync.gov/solid-aste/page/liquid-paint-recycling for more information.

NOTE: Some of the above items incur solid waste fees. Call the Transfer Station at 828-697-4505 for fee info.




From the Office of Chief Terry:

Need Help with Federal Government Issues?

The Congressional Staff of Chuck Edwards and their "Carolina Cruiser" mobile office will be in the Fletcher Town Hall south side parking lot on Tuesday, June 18th from 1:00 pm - 2:30 pm to meet with residents who need help with casework involving any federal government agency (including the Veterans Administration, Social Security, the IRS, etc.) or assist with passport and immigration matters. If you are having difficulties with government delays and "red tape", Congressman Edwards' Staff will be available to help you one-on-one with your issue.

REAL-ID Reminder

Beginning May 7, 2025, if you have not upgraded your NC driver's license to be REAL-ID compliant, you will not be able to use it to:

- Board a commercial airplane
- Access federal government facilities such as federal courthouses, federal prisons, or other federal facilities
- Visit military installations

You must visit a NC DMV office with appropriate paperwork to obtain a REAL-ID. Go to https://www.ncdot.gov/dmv/license-id/nc-real-id/Pages/default.aspx for more information about the REAL-ID and to make a DMV appointment.

2024 Property Tax Exclusion Applications Due June 1st

All applications for 2024 tax exclusions due to age, disability, or veteran status are due to the Henderson County Tax Assessor's office by June 1, 2024. These programs include: **Elderly or Permanently Disabled Exclusion** - If you qualify, you may receive an exclusion of either \$25,000 or 50% of the taxable value of your qualifying residence (whichever is greater); **Disabled Veteran's Exclusion** - Excludes from property taxes the first \$45,000 of assessed value for a permanent residence occupied by a qualifying owner and is available to veterans or their surviving spouse; and **Elderly or Disabled Property Tax Deferral (Circuit Breaker)** - If you qualify, you may receive a property tax deferral based on 4% or 5% of the applicant's income. The taxes over the limitation amount are deferred and remain as a lien on the property.
