News from the June 10th Town Council Meeting

- By Consent Agenda, Town Council approved a request from BSC Holdings, Inc. to extend conditional zoning approval (CZ-2019-02) to December 31, 2026 for BSC to have significant infrastructure in place and begin permitting for building structures at 150 Cane Creek Road.
- A Public Hearing was held for the possible approval of amendments to the Fletcher Land Development Code (LDC). In May, the Fletcher Planning Board had unanimously recommended amendments to LDC Articles 12, 14, 15, and 16 which were largely related to additional services by the Town's consulting engineer for various plan review and oversight. Edits to Article 12 also included a change to the "minor Street" width category. The amendments were approved by Town Council.
- A Public Hearing was held for the proposed budget for fiscal year 2024-2025. A \$9,729,525 budget was proposed, equating to a 3.1% increase over last year. The property tax rate was proposed to remain at \$0.28 per \$100 of assessed property value. (See the Budget article on the next page for more details.)
- Contract negotiations with Fletcher Fire & Rescue are still ongoing. There are some revisions to the current contract for fire protection services with slight differences remaining on three matters. A Special Called Meeting was scheduled for June 13th with the Fletcher Fire Board to discuss the remaining issues.
- Mark Biberdorf, Town Manager, shared updates on several items:
 - Representatives from Retail Strategies will be doing a field visit to Fletcher on June 19th. This is the retail consulting firm which we are utilizing for consulting services for the Town Center project.
 - The Town has received some complaints from Village at Windstone residents regarding noise from the Wilsonart plant in the Fletcher Industrial Park. A portion of Wilsonart's manufacturing process is steam driven. When there are no production needs, the steam header has to be released. Around 10 years ago, Wilsonart installed a muffler on the steam header to reduce the noise. The muffler system has been checked and the Plant Manager indicated that it is still working properly.
 - Rebekah Robinson, with Conserving Carolina, has submitted an application on behalf of the Town to "Connecting Communities to State Trails" grant program to create a new greenway path along Cane Creek. If received, this would be a \$100,000 grant with a \$100,000 matching obligation from the Town
 - A fiscal year-end Special Called Meeting will be held in late June, when needed, to close out the 2023-2024 budget year.

Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Budget Approved


Fletcher Town Council approved the fiscal year 2024-2025 budget on June 10th. Revenues and expenses for the new budget year are expected to total \$9,729,525 which is a slight increase from the prior year. However, the Fletcher property tax rate will remain at \$0.28 per \$100 of assessed value. Since a property revaluation was conducted last year in Henderson Co., homeowners should not see an increase in your Fletcher tax bill unless you made improvements to your property over the past year. Of the 28¢ tax levy, 10¢ goes to Fletcher and Mills River Fire & Rescue for contracted fire protection.

Town Council goals for the '24-'25 budget included:

- Maintain existing service levels while keeping the tax rate the same.
- Continue to dedicate up to 7¢ of the tax levy to year four of the 5-Year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP).
- Establish a strategy and marketing plan for attracting retail development to the Fletcher Town Center.

89% of the revenue funds for the new budget are derived from five main sources: **property taxes** are roughly 50% of revenue (basically flat as compared to last year with a slight increase in estimated business personal property revenue); **sales taxes** from consumer spending is about 25% of revenue (projected to be down due economic factors); **utility sales tax** collected by utility companies and re-distributed back to municipalities is about 8% of Town revenue (a 1.1% estimated increase); **ABC profits** from the Fletcher ABC Store is about 3% of revenue (estimated to increase by approximately 3.4% over last year); and **bank interest** on investments is estimated to be 3% of revenue.

No additional full-time or part-time positions are being added in this budget. The Town did conduct a pay classification study which will be implemented during the new fiscal year to help ensure the Town can retain and attract skilled employees to meet the needs of our residents and community.


Let's never forget the sacrifices required to obtain our independence and the freedoms we hold dear.



NC Outdoor Recreation Plan



Federal government grants are an important source of funding for parks and recreation in North Carolina. The Department of Natural and Cultural Resources and the Division of Parks and Recreation manage the Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) apportionment for N.C. For states to be eligible for the LWCF, a Statewide Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan (SCORP), must be updated every 5 years.

The 2025-2030 SCORP is called "Shaping Outdoor Recreation from Mountains to Sea" and serves as a guiding document for how state departments, divisions and recreation providers will address the outdoor recreation needs of NC residents over the next five years. North Carolina is in the process of updating its SCORP and is seeking public input.

Need Help with Federal Government Issues?

The Congressional Staff of Chuck Edwards and their "Carolina Cruiser" mobile office will be in the Fletcher Town Hall south side parking lot on Tuesday, July 30th from 1:30 pm - 3:00 pm to meet with WNC residents who are experiencing "red tape" with any federal government agency (including the Veterans Administration, Social Security, the IRS, etc.) and assist with passport and immigration matters. Traffic Pattern Change - From NC DOT

I-26 Exit 44 at Mountain Home Road has a new traffic pattern. The new interchange was opened June 24th in a diverging diamond formation, just like the Airport Road interchange. The crossover transitions traffic from the right side of the road to the left side of the road and then back again. Because traffic is on the left-hand side between the crossovers, all left turns occur without having to cross opposing traffic. It moves high volumes of traffic through an intersection without increasing the number of lanes and traffic signals and provides easier access to the interstate. Diverging diamond interchanges have proven to be successful in reducing congestion, increasing ramp capacity, and improving pedestrian and cyclist facilities in North Carolina and across the country.
